We dress in our traditional clothing and our songs are accompanied by a water drum and handcrafted rattles. Wampanoag Nation Singers & Dancers share a family friendly experience that provides a deep opportunity for audiences to learn while listening and joining us in movement. Booking Details!

Between four and six members of the Wampanoag Nation Singers & Dancers will perform, based on location and availability of performers.

If you see that we are booked on a day that you are interested in having us perform, please reach out and ask as we may still be able to accommodate your event.

Technical requirements

- We require at least three microphones (one cordless if possible) with mic stands — and an adequate amplification system for the size of the venue.
- A 30 x 30 to 50 x 50 unobstructed area for dancing is ideal, depending on the size of the anticipated crowd.
